# **Advertisement Consent Granted**

## Proposal:

Display of 2 x externally illuminated projecting signs, 3x internally illuminated fascia signs and 1x external non-illuminated notice board.

The Council has considered your application and decided to grant consent subject to the following condition(s):

### Conditions and Reasons:

1 No advertisement is to be displayed without the permission of the owner of the site or any other person with an interest in the site entitled to grant permission.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

2 No advertisement shall be sited or displayed so as to



- (a) endanger persons using any highway, railway, waterway, dock, harbour or aerodrome (civil or military);
- (b) obscure, or hinder the ready interpretation of any traffic sign, railway signal or aid to navigation by water or air; or
- (c) hinder the operation of any device used for the purpose of security or surveillance or for measuring the speed of any vehicle

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

3 Any advertisement displayed and any site used for the display of advertisements, shall be maintained in a condition that does not impair the visual amenity of the site.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

4 Any structure or hoarding erected or used principally for the purpose of displaying advertisements shall be maintained in a safe condition.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

Where an advertisement is required under these Regulations to be removed, the site shall be left in a condition that does not endanger the public or impair visual amenity.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

# Informative(s):

1 Reason for granting consent

The proposal includes the display of 2 x externally illuminated projecting signs, 3x internally illuminated fascia signs and 1x external non-illuminated notice board.

Revisions were received during the lifetime of this application to change the type of illumination from internal to external for both projecting signs. The internally illuminated fascia signs are set behind the glazing, it is noted that only the letters will be illuminated, and their luminance is in line with the Council's guidance. The notice board will not be illuminated and display the retail unit's opening hours. It is considered that the proposed signage is acceptable in terms of its siting, scale and design. The proposal is considered to preserve and enhance the character and appearance of the host building, streetscene and the Bloomsbury Conservation Area.

It would not disturb neighbouring occupiers nor be harmful to pedestrian and vehicular safety.

The site's planning history has been taken into account when coming to this decision.

Special attention has been paid to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the Conservation Area, under s.72 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 as amended by the Enterprise and Regulatory Reform Act 2013.

As such, the proposed development is in general accordance with policies D2 and D4 of the Camden Local Plan 2017. The proposed development also accords with the policies of the London Plan 2016 and the National Planning Policy Framework 2012.

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance with paragraphs 186 and 187 of the National Planning Policy Framework.
