

I wish to OBJECT to the referenced application.

The property subject to this application is directly behind my house, separated only by the two gardens and Grove Terrace Mews (a rural 18th century lane). The rear elevation (and in particular the roofline) is clearly visible from the upper floors of my house.

I object to the proposed amendments to the approved plan, and in particular to the insertion of a rooflight in the new mansard roof. I objected to the original application on the grounds that a number of aspects of the development (the new dormer windows, the large expanse of glazing to the extension and the garage, the rooflight in the extension) would create substantial light pollution in a currently dark area. Collectively, these new sources of light pollution will cause serious detriment to the dark nature of Grove Terrace Mews, creating a visual disturbance to us and other neighbours, as well as having a negative impact on the wildlife that frequents the Mews and the gardens. This impact will be even greater should the proposed new rooflight in the mansard roof be permitted.

This application will impinge on the privacy and tranquillity of this backland area and cause intrusion and disruption to us and other neighbours. For this reason the application should be refused.
