Proposal:

Observations to the adjoining borough of Brent Council for minor material amendment to create a new south facing public square fronting Engineers Way, increase height of approved main building (from 88.5m to 100m), reduce length of the approved block plan, change the massing of approved building form, create single storey pavilion building along Olympic Way, increase basement level, provide pedestrian and public realm improvements, and bridge link to Brent Civic Centre as a variation to condition 4 (Plans) of planning permission reference 14/3054 (dated 21 October 2014) for an outline application for the demolition of existing buildings and redevelopment of the site to provide up to 60,000sqm of mixed use floorspace.

The Council, as a neighbouring planning authority, has considered your request for observations on the application in relation to the proposed variation to condition 4 and hereby raises no objection.

As at the time of the original application (reference 10/3032 and subsequent variations), given the scale/nature of the variation, the site's history, location and distance away from any sensitive areas in Camden, it is unlikely that there will be any significant impacts on Camden in terms of design, amenity, land use or transport within the borough, and as such, the variation raises no additional concerns.
