There is no mention that during construction the house collapsed entirely and had to be rebuilt. The cause for this was never explained and it is hoped that the detailed BIA and other reports will preclude this happening once more.	
					It is noted that the boreholes etc.and associated soil investigation was made in August 17. This winter has seen substantial rains and my own sunken, tiled garden, situated over the same Network Rail tunnel has been flooded for the past two weeks in two inches of water. I believe the water table surface is at an exceptional high level and suggest the measurements taken in August would now be inaccurate.	
					It would be desirable to reduce the extent of the basement so that it did not intrude so far into the garden and proximity to the railway tunnel. The vibration and noise of passing trains will impinge on both bedrooms.
