Replacement of existing partially glazed timber door with new partially glazed timber door to communal entrance (Class C3).

The Council has considered your application and decided to grant permission subject to the following condition(s):

### Condition(s) and Reason(s):

The development hereby permitted must be begun not later than the end of three years from the date of this permission.

Reason: In order to comply with the provisions of Section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended).

2 All new external work shall be carried out in materials that resemble, as closely as possible, in colour and texture those of the existing building, unless otherwise

specified in the approved application.

Reason: To safeguard the appearance of the premises and the character of the immediate area in accordance with the requirements of policy D1 of the London Borough of Camden Local Plan 2017.

The development hereby permitted shall be carried out in accordance with the following approved plans: 1 x Photo; 3757/WM/01; 3757/WM/02 R-2, 3757/WM/03.

Reason: For the avoidance of doubt and in the interest of proper planning.

# Informative(s):

1 Reasons for granting permission:

The proposal seeks to replace a timber door with upper half glazing panel with like-for-like (design and material).

The original design and material (composite) of the replacement were considered to be unacceptable. Although the architectural merit of the building is not high, the symmetry and balance of the fenestrations' details (doors and windows) need to be maintained. As such, the retention of the original design of the door would be expected despite its location being to the rear of the building, and thus not in direct public view. As such, revisions were requested.

The amended proposal consists of a like-for-like timber with glass panel door and is considered to be acceptable in terms of its size, design, location and materials to be used. The new door would preserve the character and appearance of the host and adjacent buildings and the rear streetscape.

The site's planning and appeal history has been taken into account when coming to this decision.

As such, the proposed development is in general accordance with policies D1 and A1 of the Camden Local Plan 2017. The proposed development also accords with policies of the London Plan 2016; and the National Planning Policy Framework.
