In particular, I note the new management of the premises want to use the first floor space for events including, but not limited to, product launches, wedding functions and Bah Mitzvahs.</p> <p>I want to stress that when Gilgamesh hosted such events in the past, they caused considerable disturbance in the form of amplified music to local residents. Complaints were made over a number of years to Gilgamesh and Camden Council and were never dealt with satisfactorily.</p> <p>It would be completely unacceptable if local residents were to be subject to this kind of noise again. Indeed, it seems from the planning application, the new management wants to increase the number of events it holds. One of these events was one too many for local residents, so I would hope, for the sake of local residents, Camden Council rejects that part of the application that refers to the holding of events in the relevant space.</p>
