ENFORCEMENT NOTICE

ISSUED BY: THE LONDON BOROUGH OF CAMDEN

1. **THIS IS A FORMAL NOTICE** which is issued by the Council because it appears to them that there has been a breach of planning control, under Section 171 A (1) (a) of the above Act, at the land described below. They consider that it is expedient to issue this notice, having regard to the provisions of the development plan and to other material planning considerations. The Explanatory Note at the end of the Notice and the enclosures to which it refers contain important additional information.

2. **THE LAND TO WHICH THE NOTICE RELATES**

Land at: Flat B, 52 Sarre Road, London, NW2 3SL shown outlined in black on the attached plan ("the Property").

3. **THE BREACH OF PLANNING CONTROL ALLEGED**

Without planning permission: : The flat roof of the dormer has been built flush with the ridge of the existing roof rather than set down from the ridge by 0.5m as shown on the approved plans.

4. **REASONS FOR ISSUING THIS NOTICE:**

- a) It appears to the Council that the above breach of planning control has occurred within the last 4 years
- b) The rear dormer window due to its alignment and proximity to the pitch of the roof is considered to be an overly bulky and over-dominant structure with an unsympathetic design that detracts from the visual amenity and character of this property and is contrary to Camden Local Plan policies D1 (Design).

The Council do not consider that planning permission should be given because planning conditions could not overcome these problems.

5. **WHAT YOU ARE REQUIRED TO DO**

Within a period of 12 months from receipt of this Notice

Remove unauthorised rear dormer and reinstate the roof to match the original,

Or

Rebuild dormer window in line with approved scheme 2017/0169/P

6. **WHEN THIS NOTICE TAKES EFFECT**

This notice takes effect on **13th June 2018** unless an appeal is made against it beforehand.

Note Pursuant to Regulation 5 of the Town and Country (Enforcement Notices and Appeals) (England) Regulations 2002

If you appeal against the notice on Ground (a) "That planning permission should be granted for what is alleged in the enforcement notice, or that the condition which is alleged not to have been complied with should be discharged" there is a fee payable under Regulation 10 of the Town and Country Planning (Fees for Applications, Deemed Applications, Requests and Site Visits) (England) Regulations 2012/No.2920 for the deemed application for the planning permission for the development alleged to be in breach of planning control in the enforcement notice.

YOUR RIGHT OF APPEAL

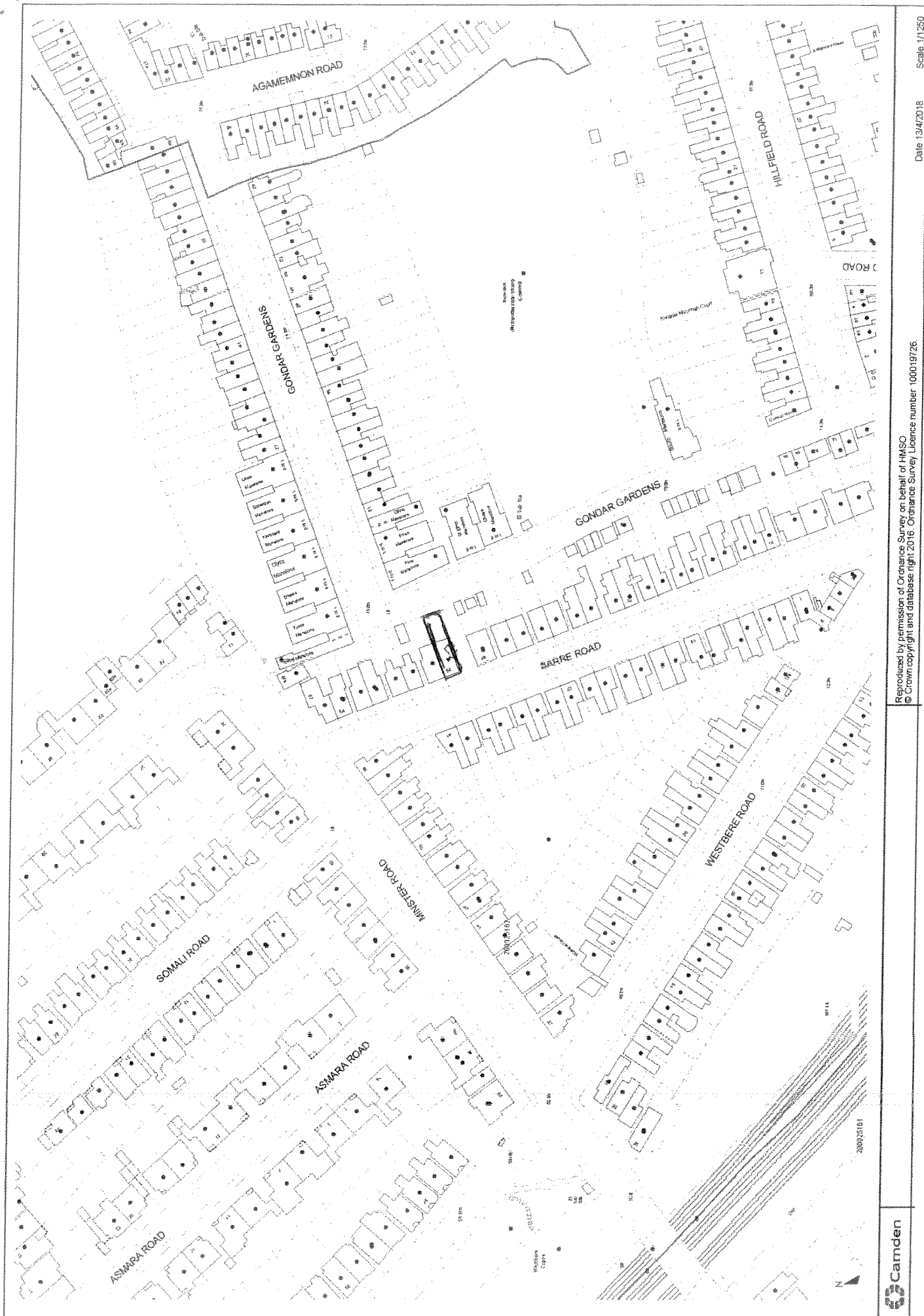
