						The other sets are varied and range from houses of multiple occupation and single dwellings each	
						having different street frontage and rear elevations on the following elements:	
						gable shapes, materials -some materiality is very low quality, fenestrations, front garden walls and drives,	
						with the roofs ranging from flat, to pitched and in no particular order.	
						The proposed scheme has looked at achieving a high quality, small scale and sensitive scheme that attempts to 'hide itself from the surroundings.	
						The owner of Flat 3 has received no information from the Chairman of the ERAM to say that there has	
						been a concerted effort to return to the original design of these pairs of villas.	
						In regards to the tree canopies we think that the scheme is significantly set back from the street and that from the dwellings opposite the distance is very long and that no visual impact is created. As for light pollution there is clearly too much distance for this to be a relevant planning issue. Especially as there are no windows on this elevation.
