From the very poor plan submitted with the application it looks like these trees are actually in the front garden not the rear. If they are the ones to the front of the house they form an important part of the visual streetscape and trees are noted to be an important part of the elements that contribute to this conservation area. There is no reason given for felling the trees. They have been pollarded previously and I would recommend that this is what is undertaken again rather than felling the trees or reduce the number of trees rather than removing all of them. If they are trees to the rear again no reason is given and given the length of the rear gardens (north facing( and backing onto a wilderness area the trees would not be causing any issue with light blocking subsidence etc. I would a						

Assessment
The trees are highly visible from the public realm. They have each been managed as a pollard at approximately 2m which is in keeping with other front garden lime trees in the area. It is considered that they would be worthy of being brought under the protection of a TPO. However on close inspection of the trees they are in poor condition and it would appear that a column of decay has developed causing them to become unstable. It is not considered that it would be expedient to bring them under the protection of a TPO.
