PERMISSION FOR DEVELOPMENT - Subject to Conditions

Proposal :

Variation to planning permission dated 25th of February 1999 (Ref: PW9802897R2) for the change of use from nursing home to 7 flats and one house including extensions and alterations, in respect of two new rear extensions on all floors and elevational variations, as shown on drawing numbers; 0995/020C, /021A, /022B and /023B.

The Council has considered your application and decided to grant permission subject to the following conditions:

Standard condition:

The development hereby permitted must be begun not later than the expiration of five years from the date of this permission.

Standard Reason:

In order to comply with the provisions of Section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

Additional conditions:

The development shall be constructed in strict accordance with the drawings hereby approved or drawings which are subsequently approved pursuant to conditions which are attached to this planning permission.



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- No development shall take place on the site until there have been submitted to and approved by the Council, details of the proposed new rear extensions and tower feature, dormers, fenestration, joinery including the garage doors and means of enclosure (i.e. gates) in elevation and section to a scale of not less than 1:50, and thereafter the development shall be implemented specifically in accordance with the approved drawings.
- Samples of materials to be used for the external finishes of the development shall be submitted to and approved by the Council before works of construction commence on site. Thereafter only materials so approved shall be used for such external finishes in carrying out the development.
- 4 Notwithstanding the provisions of Article 3 of the Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development Order) 1995 or any Order revoking and re-enacting that Order, no development within Part 1 (Classes A-H) and Part 2 (Classes A-C) of Schedule 2 of that Order shall be carried out to the dwellinghouse within the new extension hereby approved, without the grant of planning permission having first been obtained from the Council.
- None of the dwelling units shall be occupied until the car parking spaces hereby approved have been constructed in accordance with the described mechanism and are available for use. Thereafter, the car parking spaces shall be retained for the parking of the vehicles of the occupiers of the building and for no other purposes and the operating mechanism shall be maintained throughout the duration of the use.
- No part of the development herby permitted shall be begun until the contractor has discussed and agreed in writing with the Council detailed arrangements for the transportation of building goods and materials from the site. Thereafter the development shall be carried out in accordance with the agreed arrangement.
- No development shall take place until full details of hard and soft landscaping and means of enclosure of all unbuilt, open areas have been submitted to and approved by the Council.



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All hard and soft landscaping works shall be carried out to a reasonable standard in accordance with the approved landscape details by not later than the end of the planting season following completion of the development or any plase of the development, whichever is the sooner.

Any trees or areas of planting which, within a period of 5 years from the completion of the development, die, are removed or become seriously damaged or diseased, shall be replaced as soon as is reasonably possible and, in any case, by not later than the end of the following planting season, with others of similar size and species, unless the Council gives written consent to any variation.
