Thank you for allowing me to comment on the planning application 2018/1788/P which refers to the change in shop frontage for 240 Grays Inn Road, WC1.

I have no objections to the planning application, but would make the following recommendations.

- The main front door, if it is to be replaced, should be security rated to LPS 1175 SR2. This is due to the fact that the security shutters are now within the interior of the building and it is now the first line of defence.
- Glazing to have P1A laminate fitted.
- The recess to the main door way should be a minimum of 600mm in depth. This is to prevent the doorway being used for anti-social behaviour and the preventing the detritus that is left as a result. Also it will create a place where people can conceal themselves of the main public footway to commit crime and also create a fear of crime.
- The area at night should be lit with 'dusk till dawn' low level lighting to illuminate the area in front of the shop to aid
 natural surveillance on the building. LED lighting positioned so that it cannot be tampered with is preferable as it is
 low cost to maintain and low energy usage.
- Any CCTV considered should not be hindered by the lighting and be registered with the Information Commissionaire Office guidelines.
