We vehemently oppose the felling of the cherry tree in the front of our house. The reasons given for its removal are nothing short of superficial and arbitrary and appear to have been arrived at in haste.</p> <p>We have no signs of subsidence in our house yet our property is much closer to the tree so reason would dictate we would be strongly impacted by this tree.</p> <p>The ground floor flat has been sold twice in the past five years and no structural report has even mentioned subsidence and the proximity of the tree to be a cause for concern. It is well known that trees are often blamed in subsidence claims as a quick fix to remedy a situation that subsequently it is discovered was caused by something entirely different.</p> <p>What is certain is that the removal of our tree will have a deleterious effect on the fabric of our building.
