Dear Mr McClue,

I object to the re-siting of the grade II listed Hampstead Figure Sculpture to a location at the rear of the Sports Hall as part of the development work for 100 Avenue Road.

The new location will not enhance the setting of the sculpture and its original intended relationship with the library. In his report allowing the 'Swiss Cottage Avenue Road development' in Feb 2016 the Inspector recommended "repositioning [the sculpture] with careful thought...to substantially enhance the setting of the sculpture and its relationship with the library". The proposed location on Adelaide Road is not in keeping with the Inspectors' recommendation.

Of the options set out, option 2 [HS 6.1], directly in front of the library, most respects the Inspector's stipulations. I do not believe that children would climb on the statue if it is placed near the outside gym. The children's play area is fenced off and separate. The outside gym is not a children's play area. The proximity of Avenue Road would mean that it would be rare for children to use it unsupervised.

This is an important issue that merits a proper public consultation with the local community.
