The Council has considered your application and decided to grant permission subject to the following condition(s):

Condition(s) and Reason(s):

The development hereby permitted must be begun not later than the end of three years from the date of this permission.

Reason: In order to comply with the provisions of Section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended).

All new external work shall be carried out in materials that resemble, as closely as possible, in colour and texture those of the existing building, unless otherwise specified in the approved application.

Reason: To safeguard the appearance of the premises and the character of the immediate area in accordance with the requirements of policy D1 and D2 of the London Borough of Camden Local Plan 2017.

The development hereby permitted shall be carried out in accordance with the following approved plans:

Location plan, Design and access statement, 10-101 Rev B, 20-117 Rev B, 20-118 Rev B.

Reason:

For the avoidance of doubt and in the interest of proper planning.

- Your proposals may be subject to control under the Building Regulations and/or the London Buildings Acts that cover aspects including fire and emergency escape, access and facilities for people with disabilities and sound insulation between dwellings. - 3 Reason for granting permission:

The replacement ground floor windows would not result in any enlarged openings to the front elevation of the subject property and would be of a similar scale, proportion and design to the existing windows being replaced. The proposal is considered to comprise high quality materials and the scale and design would respect the context of the host building and site surroundings. Within this context, it is considered that the proposed replacement windows would preserve the character and appearance of the host dwelling and surrounding Redington Frognal conservation area.

As the windows would replace the existing there would be no increase in overlooking, as such the proposal would not harm the amenity of adjoining occupiers. No new openings are being created and no amenity concerns are therefore raised.

No objections were received prior to making this decision. The planning history of the site and surrounding area were taken into account when coming to this decision. Special attention has been paid to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the conservation area, under s.72 of The Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 as amended by the Enterprise and Regulatory Reform Act 2013.

As such, the proposal is in general accordance with Policies D1, D2 and A1 of the Camden Local Plan 2017. The proposed development also accords with the London Plan 2016 and the National Planning Policy Framework 2012.

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance with paragraphs 186 and 187 of the National Planning Policy Framework.
