				We are already adversely affected by the loss of Southern daylight and sunlight and even seemingly incremental changes such as a further extension of the roof height by adding metal handralis and re-locating the photo-voltaic panels and the adding of ducting will have further significant consequences and a major negative impact on our family home.		
				The reason given for the relocation of the PV-panels, as the North point was marked incorrectly on the approved drawing plans in favour of the development, makes me question whether the Daylight and Sunlight Assessment has been done correctly and I would ask that this is reviewed independently.		
				I also note that the variation is applying for changes to the hard landscaping etc at a time when the local residents have been told by the Developer that it is too late to make any change to the paint colour of the extension at the end of our gardens to a less oppressive colour than dark grey.
