Proposal: Display of two internally illuminated digital media screens (4m high x 27m wide and 6.5m high x 60m wide) on circular and oval ventilation shafts respectively.

The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** advertisement consent for the following reason:

Reason for Refusal

The proposed 2 display screens, by reason of their size, locations, design and method of illumination, would be detrimental to the appearance of the host structures and Kings Cross Square, the character and appearance of the Kings Cross Conservation Area and the setting of the adjacent listed buildings (Great Northern Hotel, Kings Cross Station and St Pancras station), contrary to policies D1 (design), D2 (heritage) and D4 (advertisements) of the London Borough of Camden Local



Plan 2017.

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance with paragraphs 186 and 187 of the National Planning Policy Framework.
