Dear all.

The requested investigative works are complete - please refer to the photographs attached. I comment as follows:

1st floor - rear reception room

The floorboards have been numbered and removed in sequence. There are multiple existing notches in the joists that I suggest we use for the AC pipe runs as depicted on our plans. Therefore all can be done below floor level in this room.

Please confirm if this can now be closed up as the floorboards have been de-nailed and stacked in order, in preparation for reinstatement.

1st floor - door onto new terrace

As suspected, there is a void behind the plasterboarded area to right of the existing opening (looking into the dwelling from outside). Within this void there is the rainwater pipe, which we would retain, and a non-original concrete lintel above the door head. NB: this bears onto the brick only 65-70mm and is therefore dangerous!

3rd floor - spine walls

The plaster has been carefully removed. We have kept the lath.

I suggest simple structural openings are created as per our proposed plan

Our proposal would be to replace with an arched head to match adjacent windows on this elevation as shown on our proposal (ie centred on the existing window above).

Can you please confirm that this is in order and when approval can be expected?
