Historic England was pleased to be involved in pre-application discussions prior to the formal submission of Listed Building Consent. 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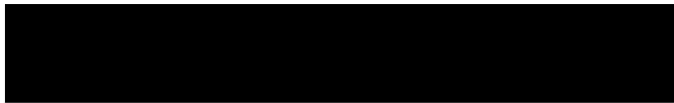
