Proposal:

Installation of fixed LED lighting strips to existing aluminium perforated screen facade on the front and side elevations of the restaurant and bar (Use Class A3 / A4) (retrospective) Drawing Nos: SLP/A4/FIN.19.2; PL/04 (dated 08/02/2018); PL/05 (dated 08/02/2018)

The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** planning permission for the following reason(s):

Reason(s) for Refusal

The proposed installation of LED strip lighting to the facade would, by virtue of the extent of the lighting and its method of illumination as well as the visual prominence of the building be visually intrusive and have a harmful impact on the appearance of the building, the streetscene and detract from the appearance of the area generally, contrary to policies D1, D3 and D4 of the London Borough of Camden Local Plan



(2017).

1 ENFORCEMENT ACTION TO BE TAKEN SHOULD LIGHTING BE USED

The Director of Culture and Environment will instruct the Borough Solicitor to issue an Enforcement Notice alleging a breach of planning control should the installed lighting be used without permission.

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance with paragraphs 186 and 187 of the National Planning Policy Framework.
