T2 - Medium Shrub - Lightly retrim regrowth to form a neater specimen.

Rear Garden:

T3 - Medium Hydrangea - Lightly retrim regrowth to form a neater specimen.

T4 - 2 x Small Shrubs - Lightly retrim regrowth to form a neater specimen.

GRP1 - Group of Ivy - Ivy Growing on wall and streetlight - Face back top and both sides to form a neater specimen and remove ivy from streetlight
