I am making an objection to the planning application above to the building of an outhouse on the garden of 13 Lyndhurst Terrace.

Lyndhurst Terrace is a conservation area. Any additional office buildings in the garden destroys the nature of gardens in the area.

More importantly from a noise viewpoint, there has been an increase in outdoor activities during the day and also in the early evening from 6-9pm from the school and thus more noise. It has been like living on the high street at times with the amount of noise generated and not a residential area. Even schools have break times and lunch times that last a short time. However, not for this school where the students are out in the garden at various times of the day. I feel at times, quite stressed out with the incessant noise everyday and not get any peace and quiet, especially from March until October when there is more activity outside. Is there any control over a commercial enterprise in a residential area?
