The Council has considered your application and decided to grant permission.

Informative(s):

1 This approval of details application (retrospective) seeks to regularise the position with regards to landscaping on the western end of Dangoor Walk, to the south of the Francis Crick Institute. Trees were previously shown erroneously on a landscape plan on Dangoor Walk. This plan had been submitted for context purposes only and was not intended by the applicant to

be listed as an approved drawing (for application reference 2015/0384/P). These trees were not planted and could not be planted given the servicing requirements of this part of the site. Officers consider that the quantity of trees and the quality of the landscaping to be acceptable across the whole site. The landscaping for the Francis Crick site has all been completed and is of high quality, in line with the original permission. The application has been discussed with an Enforcement Officer who is happy with the proposals. The partial redischarge of the condition is therefore considered acceptable.

2 You are advised that this approval should be read in conjunction with the approved application 2015/0384/P.
