[REDACTED] I am writing to **strongly object** to the planning application for a Heavy Lorry Route in Harrington Street, planning application number 2018/3241/HS2.

Please use Granby Terrace to shift all the rubble. This route is far better than Harrington Street.

Harrington Street is a residential street where children play (because their green spaces have been taken away by the recent new developments caused by HS2). Older people also use this street and many use mobility vehicles and would be affected by pedestrian barriers. Disabled people in our block will also be terribly affected if they cannot use Varndell Street (if it is to be blocked off to all traffic except HS2 lorries. It will be a terrible disruption to all the residents who are already suffering so much because of HS2. I implore you to push for HS2 to use Granby Terrace to shift the rubble.
