Repairs to the delaminating section of garden wall Drawing Nos: 893/07 DEE001 P01 (drawing), design and access statement, heritage statement, location plan, site access plan

The Council has considered your application and decided to grant Listed Building Consent subject to the following condition(s):

Conditions And Reasons:

1 Notwithstanding drawing 893/07 DEE001 P01, the addition of stone capping to the top of the wall is not consented.

Reason: In order to safeguard the special architectural and historic interest of the building in accordance with the requirements of policy D2 of the Camden Local Plan 2017.

2 The development hereby permitted shall be carried out in accordance with the following approved plans:

893/07 DEE001 P01 (drawing), design and access statement, heritage statement, location plan, site access plan

Reason: In order to safeguard the special architectural and historic interest of the building in accordance with the requirements of policy D2 of the Camden Local Plan 2017.

3 All new work and work of making good shall be carried out to match the existing adjacent work as closely as possible in materials and detailed execution.

Reason: In order to safeguard the special architectural and historic interest of the building in accordance with the requirements of policy D2 of the Camden Local Plan 2017.

The works hereby permitted shall be begun not later than the end of three years from the date of this consent.

Reason: In order to comply with the provisions of Section 18 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990.

Informative(s):

1 The site is a 17th/18th-century grade-II-listed garden wall surrounding a grade-I-listed house.

The wall is composed of two skins, one of which appears to be separating from the other. To arrest this movement, the applicant wishes to bind the two together using hidden inserted metal rods and resin, and to rebuild a small missing section.

Contrary to the development description, the drawing shows a stone coping along the top of the wall. This will greatly alter the appearance of the wall and is not justified (or mentioned) in the supporting documents, so is excluded from the consent by condition.

The insertion of the rods is a generally accepted and minimally invasive procedure avoiding complete rebuilding of the wall.

The proposed works will not harm the special interest of the grade-II-listed building.

The application has been advertised in the press and by means of a site notice, whereby there were no consultation responses. The site's planning history has been taken into account in making this decision.

Special attention has been paid to the desirability of preserving the special interest of the listed building, under s.16 of the Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas Act 1990 as amended by the Enterprise and Regulatory Reform Act (ERR) 2013

As such, the proposal is in general accordance with policy D2 of the Camden Local Plan 2017. The proposed development also accords with the London

Plan 2016 and the NPPF.
