Rear Garden:

T1: Purple Plum: Reduce crown by 20-25%, thin crown density by 20%, remove dead wood and remove epicormic growth. T2 & T3: Birch: Remove dead wood throughout the crowns, thin crown density of both trees by 20% and reduce crowns by up to 20%: T4: Birch: Clad in climbing plant. Remove dead wood and broken branches, remove climbing plants, thin crown density by 20% and carry out remedial pruning. T5: Holly: Located on left hand boundary. Poor condition due to past poor pruning techniques. Correct stub cuts, remove dead wood and reduce crown by 20% Reasons: -Help manage trees at reasonable dimensions for their locations. Reduce potential hazards. Increase light levels to the garden -Help curtail the trees' sphere of influence in relation to walls and buildings whilst preserving tree health, natural characteristics and aesthetic value. 6.
