The work could compromise the structural stability of algeent buildings leading to subsidence. There have been similar developments recently in 2 terraced houses on the opposite side of the road both leading to damage to neighbouring properties. The houses were not designed for such excavations. The conversion from one family house to 3 flats will lead to increase population density and demand on services and local parking. Finally the dust, dirt, and noise during the building and excavation and increase traffic from lorries will have a deleterious effect locally. Such works should be restricted to weekdays office hours.
