**ENFORCEMENT NOTICE**

**ISSUED BY: THE LONDON BOROUGH OF CAMDEN**

1. **THIS IS A FORMAL NOTICE** which is issued by the Council because it appears to them that there has been a breach of planning control, under Section 171 A (1) (a) of the above Act, at the land described below. They consider that it is expedient to issue this notice, having regard to the provisions of the development plan and to other material planning considerations. The Explanatory Note at the end of the Notice and the enclosures to which it refers contain important additional information.

2. **THE LAND TO WHICH THE NOTICE RELATES**

**Land at: 6 Bolton Road, London, NW8 0RJ** as shown outlined in black on the attached plan (“the Property”).

3. **THE BREACH OF PLANNING CONTROL ALLEGED**

**Without planning permission:** Removal of first floor stone balcony with cast iron railings

4. **REASONS FOR ISSUING THIS NOTICE:**

- a) It appears to the Council that the above breach of planning control has occurred within the last **4 years**
- b) The loss of the first floor stone balcony with cast iron railings is considered to negatively impact upon the host property and wider St Johns Wood Conservation area by removing a principal feature of the terrace creating a void which diminishes the uniformity of the terrace. The development is therefore contrary to policies A1 (Managing the Impact of Development), D1 (Design) and D2 (Heritage) of the Camden Local Plan 2017, St Johns Wood Conservation Area Appraisal 2009 and Camden Guidance Design 1

The Council do not consider that planning permission should be given because planning conditions could not overcome these problems.


5. **WHAT YOU ARE REQUIRED TO DO**

Within a period of **nine months** of the Notice taking effect:

- 1) Reinststate the first floor stone balcony with cast iron railings to match the original design, shape and material
- 2) Make good any damage to the building as a result of the works

6. **WHEN THIS NOTICE TAKES EFFECT**

This notice takes effect on **23<sup>rd</sup> November 2018** unless an appeal is made against it beforehand.

**Note Pursuant to Regulation 5 of the Town and Country (Enforcement Notices and Appeals) (England) Regulations 2002**
