Apologies for a delayed objection to the felling of the yew tree in the garden of 1 Boscastle Road.

I note that the applicants state that it has no amenity value to the street – this is true, but the amenity value to many of the houses in Grove Terrace is considerable.

Our large Ash tree and Two holm oaks abutting onto Grove Terrace Mews apparently have great amenity value to the conservation area and to Boscastle Road as they help to screen houses from view, so I am a loss to understand why a splendid yew which screens us from Boscastle Road houses and is part of the Dartmouth Park Conservation area also, should be cut down, rather than pruned appropriately.

Surely a tree of that size deserves a TPO?
