Hans Sloane was physician to Queen Anne, King George I, and King George II.

In 1716, he was created a baronet, becoming the first medical practitioner to receive a hereditary title.



In 1727, he became president of the Royal Society, succeeding physicist and mathematician Sir Isaac Newton; he held the position until 1741

Sloane bequeathed his collection to the nation and it became the founding collection of the British Museum.

In 1695 Sloane took out a lease from The Bedford Estates for 4 Bloomsbury Place where he lived until 1742

In 1719, Sloane was elected president of the Royal College of Physicians, a post he served until 1735.



Sloane was a keen collector and by his death in 1753 had collected over 71,000 objects.

In 2019 The Bedford Estates will present a stunning self-contained approx. 4,300 sq ft office building with private garden.



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
