Customers apart, you would have the constant revving of delivery bykes coming and going throughout opening hours.

People coming and going to this venue late at night could impact on the area in a negative way, with noise, litter, urination etc. The Police have clearly stated that the main trouble at night is not from pubs and clubs, but from the takeaways, which is a serious issue in Camden Town, and we certainly don't want to see it increase with another takeaway.

Through the Public Health Agenda, which I am responsible for, we are tackling a rise in childhood obesity and as there are three primary schools in that immediate area, Being responsible for this important programme I would ask that you refuse this application in its entirety.
