Hope this email finds you well.

We have received an objection from The Fitzrovia Partnership at the above planning application and I note that it refers mainly to phone boxes.

I just want to clarify that the proposal under the current application is for a InLink panel, accessed externally, with no enclosed areas which leads to the proliferation of antisocial behaviour. Please see drawing attached.

The proposal is part of a wider project across the borough which aims to remove the existing phone boxes you are referring to. The removal of existing kiosks is the main trigger to consider these panels acceptable by the Council, following a thorough assessment on their location and the impact on pedestrian permeability, traffic safety and heritage assets. Generally the Council agreed to a removal rationalisation of 2 kiosks for 1 InLink. For the sites along Tottenham Court Road, we are aiming to secure for 7 Inlink panels the removal of 22 existing BT kiosks. In locations where InLink panels were acceptable the Council secured the removal of existing kiosks as well as maintenance of the new panels by the applicant, via a Section 278 Legal Agreement linked with the Highways Act.

In light of the above would you please let me know if you still want to object to this proposal?
