My name is Saskia Lichtenstern, I am 44 years old and I am a breast cancer survivor.

I finished treatment 5 years ago, but it has become my life purpose to help other survivors adjust to their new life post cancer treatment.

I had a pretty aggressive oestrogen based cancer that was discovered when I was 39 years old, I had a single mastectomy with all my lymph nodes removed. I was living in South Africa at the time and so I had my treatment in hospitals in Cape Town.

The truth is I pretty much went through that hell on my own. Sure I was blessed to have family and friends around me, but there was no support system in place, there was nowhere for me to go where I could speak to someone and they would understand.

When I returned to the UK and found out about Breast Cancer Haven I was completely blown away!

Now Breast Cancer Haven is closing, and this just cannot happen! We need to find a new home for the Haven so they can continue to transform lives, and I think moving it to the Future Dreams House in Kings Cross is a great idea.

Future Dreams House is one billion percent needed for women going through the hell of breast cancer, and for their family that is going through that hell with them.

Future Dreams House is so important, and the Breast Cancer Haven is so important...they are integral to the journey of any and every breast cancer survivor.

Whenever someone I know is diagnosed with breast cancer, Future Dreams and the haven are the first places I direct them too.

I totally support the new centre being relocated to Camden. Even though I live in South West London the transport links are excellent and it will not impinged on my journey. In fact I think it is a much better location because it is far more central so it is an easier journey for most.
