				During the winter months, adjacent to the site at which the floating classroom is proposed to be moored, vessels moored on the canal burn solid fuel for heat, often with scant regard for regulations relating to smokeless fuel. As the canal is set in a 'cutting' between buildings, the smoke from such solid fuel burning does not disperse easily and tends simply to 'sit' around canal level, particularly on foggy days. The smell from such smoke is acrid and doubtless it is very troublesome to those with asthma or breathing difficulties. Children with asthma in particular should not be exposed to such fumes. The residents of the encampment sited next to the bridge carrying Regents Park Road over the canal also burn solid fuel for heat, which is very noticeable when jogging or walking past their site.
