## Reason(s) for Refusal

The proposed roof extension and associated terrace and planters, by reason of their resulting bulk, form and detailed design would appear as incongruous additions, disrupting the roofline which is largely unimpaired, and would have a detrimental impact on the character and appearance of the host building, the terrace of which it forms a part and the wider Kentish Town Conservation area, contrary to policies D1 (Design) and D2 (Heritage) of Camden Local Plan 2017 and Policy D3 of the

## Kentish Town Neighbourhood Plan (2016).
