It seems a major step to fell one of two mature trees in close proximity at the centre of the Gardens that are of high visual significance.  The submitted document titled 'Urban London plane tree dieback linked to fungi in the Botryosphaeriaceae' states in its introduction: "In order to reduce the financial costs, it is thus sound to ascertain whether C. platani is really present or not. Genetic identification comes then as a choice tool to help in the management of plane tree canker stain and in the decision to apply or not severe felling and disinfection measures." From the information accompanying the application, it seems no sampling to confirm the presence of Neofusicoccum parvum on plane T76 has been carried out. It appears that visual inspection has been relied on to confirm the	
				pathogen when, in recent previous arboricultural surveys, this has not been evident. We suggest confirmation by sampling should be sought.  Because of its high visual significance and prominent position in the Gardens, more detail of the size of replacement planting would be advisable.
