Hi there Laura,

I'm getting in touch to express my support for the change of use to be granted for Breast Cancer Haven's proposed new premises in Birkenhead Street, Kings Cross - Future Dreams House.

Breast Cancer Haven is an incredible charity currently based in Fulham, supporting women across London through their breast cancer treatment and experiences. They are having to move out of their home of 20 years because the lease is expiring in September 2019.

I was diagnosed with breast cancer in April this year and visited the Haven shortly after finishing 17 weeks of chemotherapy - I was looking for support to help me deal with the news that I was going to have to have a mastectomy. Not only did I get mental support in the form of counselling, but I've also already benefitted from nutritional advice and reflexology, with more free sessions including acupuncture to look forward to in the coming months once I've recovered from my operation. They tailor treatment programmes to each individual, offering 10 free sessions which is so generous and quite incredible really. I'm getting emotional just thinking about what a help the charity has been to me already!

I'm so glad I visited when I did as it's been really beneficial to have additional therapies to complement (and help me recover from) the conventional treatment that I've received. The place really does feel like a haven too - I think it's really important that they are able to keep operating in central London, not just from a selfish point of view, but for the benefit of all the other people who will no doubt be diagnosed with this horrible disease in the months and years to come.

A new premises in Kings Cross would be amazing - good transport links are key as it's often more difficult to travel whilst receiving treatment. Fulham felt like a bit of a trek for me but it's been 100% worth the journey each time I've visited so far. A Kings Cross location would hopefully make visiting easier for many more people.

I understand that the planning meeting is scheduled for 6th November - please don't hesitate to get in touch if you need any further information from me before then. I really hope that the change of use application is permitted so that Breast Cancer Haven and Future Dreams can get the new home that they deserve and continue to do their amazing work.

Dear Laura Hazelton,

I am a medical oncologist at the Whittington, treating patients with breast cancer.
I am fully committed to supporting Future Dreams house as the new London base for the Haven.

This project is essential to the care of patients with breast cancer in London for many reasons:

The Haven offers a large number of services that are either not funded by the NHS or are inadequately funded by the NHS. Examples include - complementary therapies such as acupuncture and other touch therapies; counselling services, not just aimed at supporting the patient but supporting families and carers too; nutritional advice; management of menopausal symptoms - a side effect of breast cancer treatment that causes significant distress and often leads women to discontinue treatment, at their detriment.

A central base is vital as most patients are not willing (or able) to travel more than 30 minutes one-way.

Supporting the NHS in implementing self-management pathways - the follow up of patients with breast cancer is changing to a remote self-management pathway. Future Dreams House would be ideally placed to complement and assist with this process. Once the majority of clinical care is complete (surgery, chemotherapy, radiotherapy), patients are to be discharged with yearly mammograms being remotely monitored. At this stage Future Dreams House would be ideally suited to provide the non-clinical care needs away from a clinical environment. I think that this has the opportunity to improve compliance with ongoing therapies (e.g. endocrine) as well as improve the success of remote monitoring, as patients will not feel "abandoned." Remote monitoring or self-management should improve a patients experience if it works well - I think Future Dreams could provide one of the key elements to the success of self-management.

I hope that you will find this helpful in supporting the planning application for Future Dreams House.
