T6:Birch Located outside 86-93. Reduce crown by 20%, thin crown density by 20% and remove dead wood.
T7:Sorbus Located outside 86-93. Reduce crown by 20%, thin crown density by 20% and remove dead wood.
T8:Birch Located outside 94-101.Reduce height by 20%.Reduce lateral and sub lateral branches by 25%. Thin crown density by 20% and remove dead wood.
T9:Purple Plum Located outside 102-109. Reduce height by 25-30%. Reduce to clear building by 3.00-4.00m. Thin crown density by 25%. Remove dead wood and raise crown over pavement by 1.00m.

T10:Birch Located outside 102-109.Reduce height by 25%.Reduce lateral and sub lateral branches by 20% and thin crown density by 20%.

T11:Birch Located outside 110-117.Reduce crown by 20%, thin crown density by 20% and remove dead wood.

T12:Yew Located outside 110-117.Raise crown by 1.00m.Reduce crown by 25-30% and thin crown density by 20%.

T13:Purple Plum Located on the frontage of 110-117. Acute lean noted and tree is being partially supported by a boundary wall. No sign of root plate movement. On close inspection to the rear stem some cracking was noted. The tree has an included union of two major stems and is located over a public footway. Fell to ground level and treat with systemic herbicide.

14:Hawthorn Located outside 118-126. Reduce crown by 25%, thin crown density by 30% and remove dead wood.

T15:Malus Located outside 118-126. Remove dead wood.

T16:Cherry Located outside 118-126. Tree has a lean but appears stable with a relatively healthy crown structure.
T17:Acer Located outside 134-141. Reduce crown by 20-25%. Thin crown density by 20-25% and remove dead wood.
T18:Mature Chestnut Located outside 142-149. Bark wounds noted as possible signs of canker. Inspect main unions. Reduce to previous reduction points, approx. 30%, whilst preserving a suitable amount of furnishing growth to ensure crown continuity. Thin crown density by 25% and remove dead wood. T19: Purple Plum Located outside 150-157. Remove dead wood. Thin crown density by 20-25% and reduce extraneous branches back in to main crown structure.

T20:Cherry Located In Alfred Road. Several faults in crown structure. Remove dead wood, reduce lateral and sub lateral growth by 25-30%, remove dead wood & thin crown density by 20%.
