The Council has considered your application and decided to grant consent subject to the following condition(s):

Conditions and Reasons:

1 No advertisement is to be displayed without the permission of the owner of the site or any other person with an interest in the site entitled to grant permission.

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

- 2 No advertisement shall be sited or displayed so as to
 - (a) endanger persons using any highway, railway, waterway, dock, harbour or aerodrome (civil or military);
 - (b) obscure, or hinder the ready interpretation of any traffic sign, railway signal or

aid to navigation by water or air; or

(c) hinder the operation of any device used for the purpose of security or surveillance or for measuring the speed of any vehicle

Reason: - As required by regulation 2(1) and Schedule 2 of the Town & Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (England) Regulations 2007.

Any advertisement displayed and any site used for the display of advertisements, shall be maintained in a condition that does not impair the visual amenity of the site

4 Any structure or hoarding erected or used principally for the purpose of displaying advertisements shall be maintained in a safe condition.

Informative(s):

1 Reason for granting advertisement consent:

The proposed signage is considered appropriate for its location and its setting within a largely glazed commercial shopfront. The signage comprises of 1x internally illuminated block signage upon the associated ATM consisting of a green background and translucent white lettering and 1x internally illuminated black and green surround signage.

The signage is considered acceptable in its location, size, scale, design and method of illumination and will not harm the character and appearance of the host building and the surrounding South Hampstead Conservation Area.

The signage would not adversely impact on neighbouring residential amenity or be harmful to either pedestrian or vehicular safety.

Thea application site's history and relevant appeal decisions have been taken into account when coming to this decision.

Considerable importance and weight has been attached and special attention has been paid to the desirability of preserving and enhancing the character and appearance of the conservation area, under s.72 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas Act) 1990 as amended by the Enterprise and Regulatory

Reform Act (ERR) 2013.

As such, the proposed development is in general accordance with policy D4 of the London Borough of Camden Local Plan 2017. The development also accords with the London Plan 2016 and the National Planning Policy Framework 2018.
