My name is and in at the age I was diagnosed with breast cancer. Unfortunately for me living in London being able to visit the Haven and experience the amazing facilities and having the chance to meet other ladies like myself wasn't a possible. For me Fulham was just too far to travel to, as you can imagine having to have chemo every three weeks and being very poorly having to travel across London to an area not so easily accessible from all areas of London was just too difficult. Had the Haven been in a more central location I know that I would have been able to enjoy and benefit from having such a wonderful place at such a convenient location. Kings Cross is such an easily accessible place, not just from anywhere within London but for also anywhere in the Country. There are many parts of the UK that don't have a Haven centre and by having one in Kings Cross ladies living anywhere can pracitically get on one train on an uninterrupted journey and be able to use these facilities.

The services that this Haven will be able to provide will be so important to ladies going through such an ordeal, a place where they can get the support they need, councelling, therapies, treatments, a restaurant where they can eat and socialize with friends and family, a gym catering for mixed abilities, a makeup studio where they can feel themselves again, financial advisors to help with all the money worries that cancer brings and just somewhere to have a coffee and a chat anytime they need to. Places like these are vital to the well being, rehabilitation and road to recovery after having cancer.

The plans for this new Haven are just phenomenal and would help so many women not only in London but up and down the country. With the Fulham Haven going this leaves London, the capital, the heart of this country with nowhere for the thousands of breast cancer patients to go. Some of these women may not have close family or friends and places like this are absolutely vital.
