Number 2a Tanza Rd has been totally omitted from the drawings and has been incorporated into my freehold. Please take a look at your records for 28 Nassington Road and 2b Tanza Rd. I cannot understand why the submitted drawings are so badly misrepresenting the boundaries. The applicant has applied to build this extension in the past and I'm not aware of incorrect drawings having been previously submitted though I can't say for sure. Also I own the land directly abutting the garden of 26 Tanza Rd, which is my parkig space. (small triangular shape next to no2 Tanza). The applicant has illegally used this area to transfer building materials over my wall when he renovated his flat in the past. His builders broke my fence and did not repair it. They used this, my parking space, illegally while I was away.
