One neighbour purchased a Dyson air cooler since they were unable to open their windows. The extraction fan is also loud and has been a disturbance at night having been installed directly below our bedroom windows.

Disappointingly the extraction fan is still being used by the restaurant from time to time, despite planning officers instructing the restaurant not to. With the fan, as in several other areas, the restaurant has shown little respect for regulations and the local residential community.
