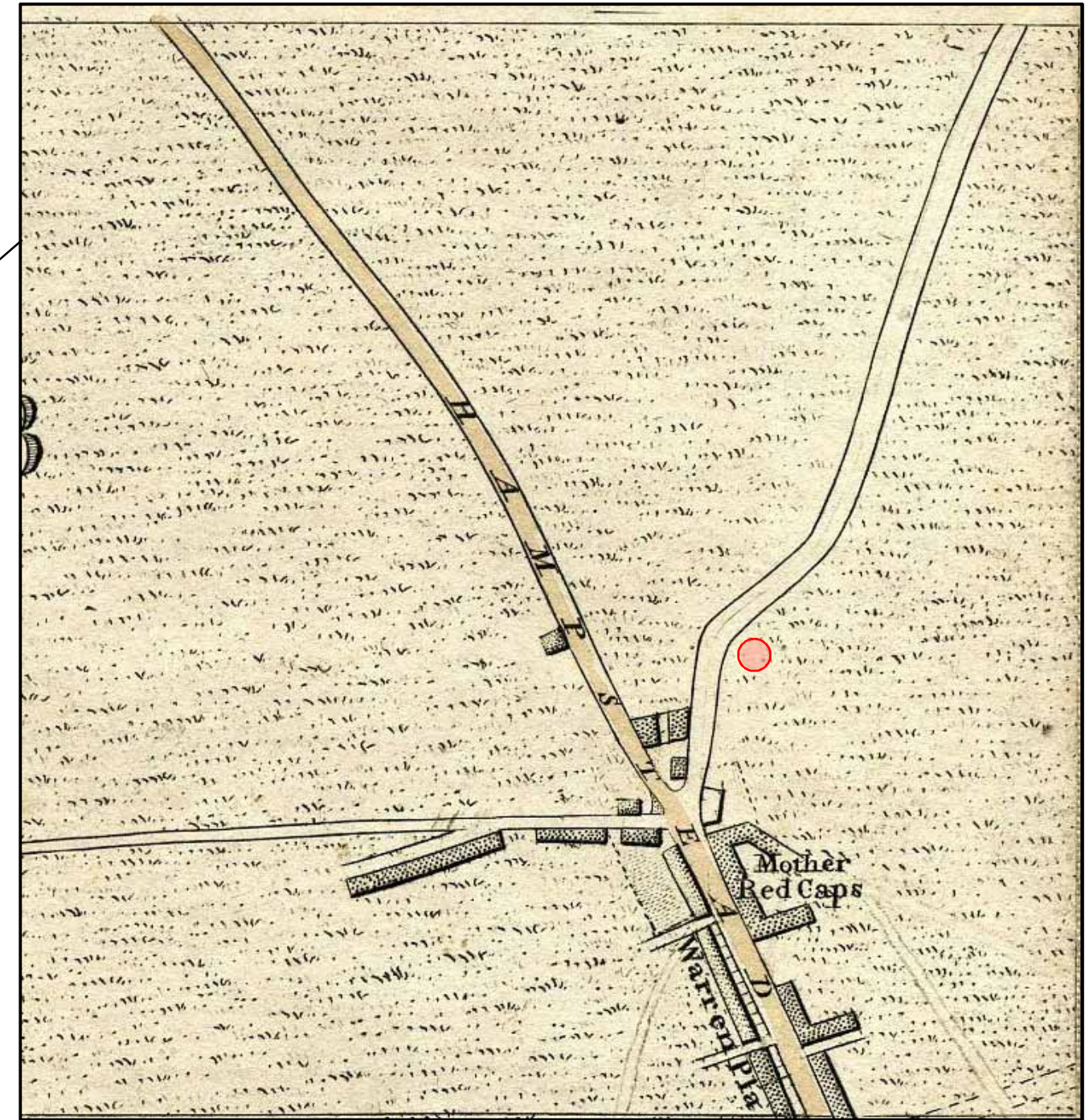
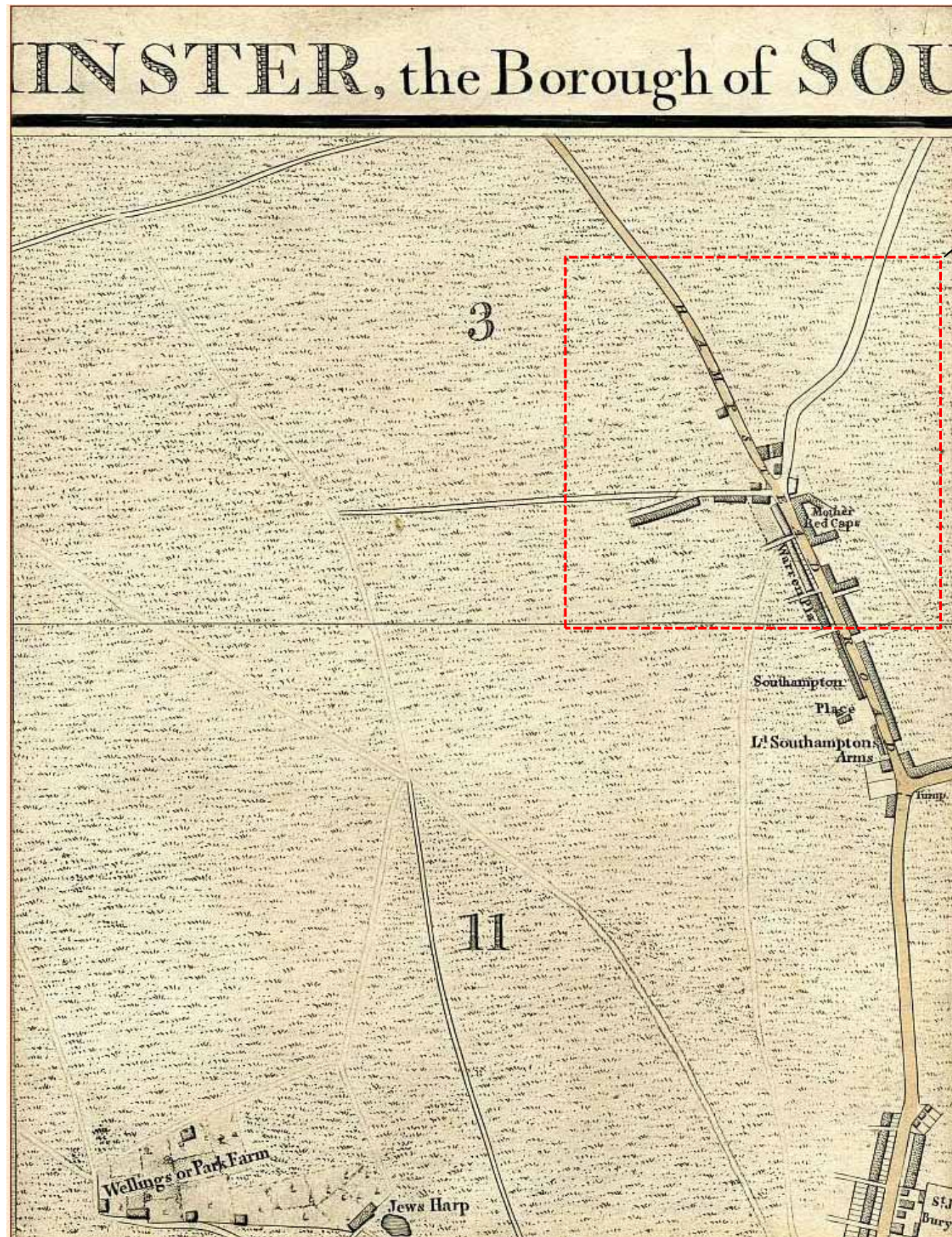


Figure 2. 1795: Cary's Map of London; approximate locations of site marked in red.

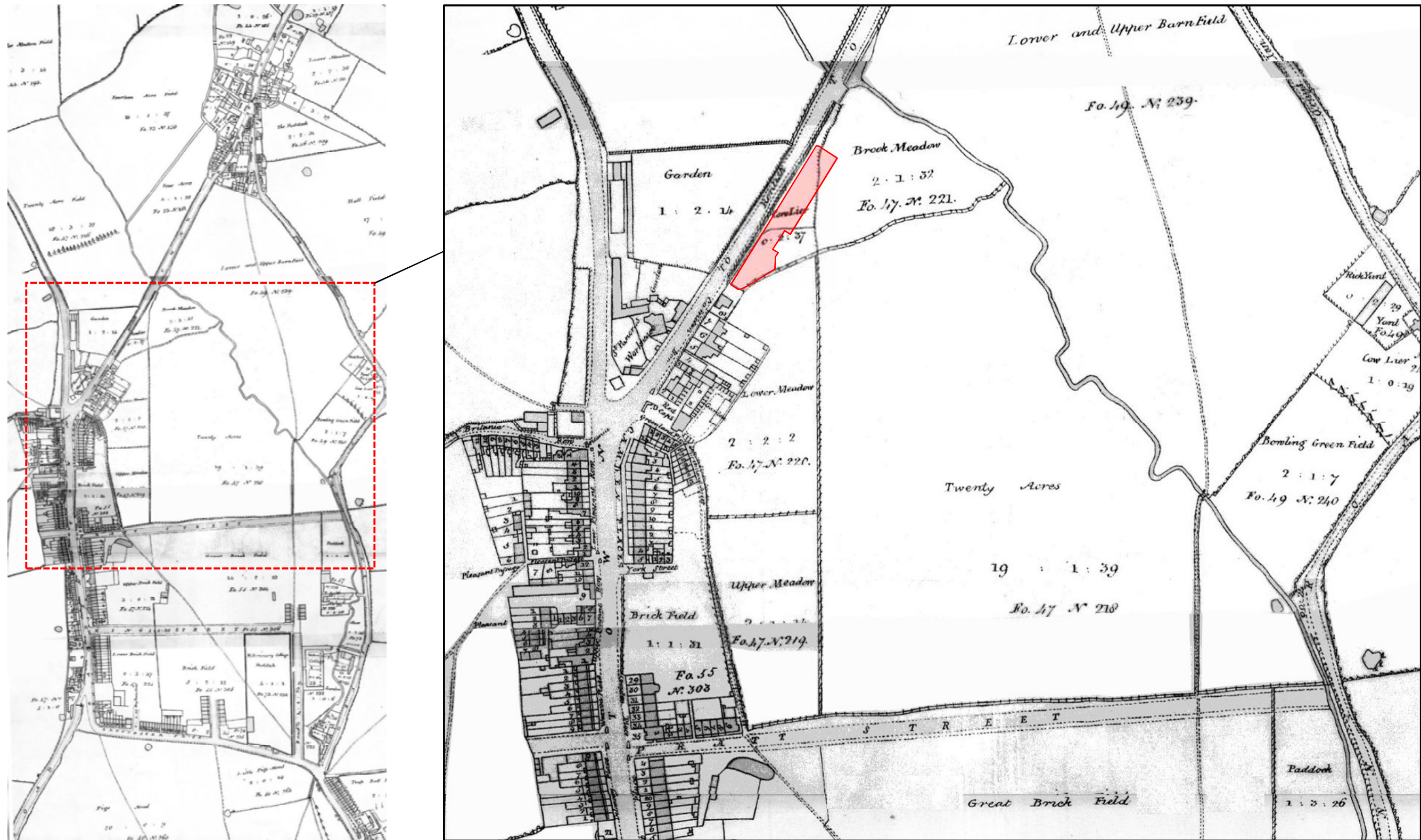


Figure 3. 1800: Thompson's map of the St Pancras Parish, approximate locations of site marked in red. In 1801, the farmland consisting of two main fields (marked on the maps as (Upper) Brooke Meadow and Upper Meadow) was linked to St Martin's Gardens date that back to the C13 (off Pratt Street). The land belonged to Lord Camden. The northern boundary of Brook Meadow was River Fleet. In the early C19, the Regents Canal was built over the Fleet. The Fleet still occasionally made its presence felt: in 1826, the river was 65' wide at flood as it crossed Kentish Town Road opposite what is now the entrance to Sainsbury's Car Park in Camden Town.

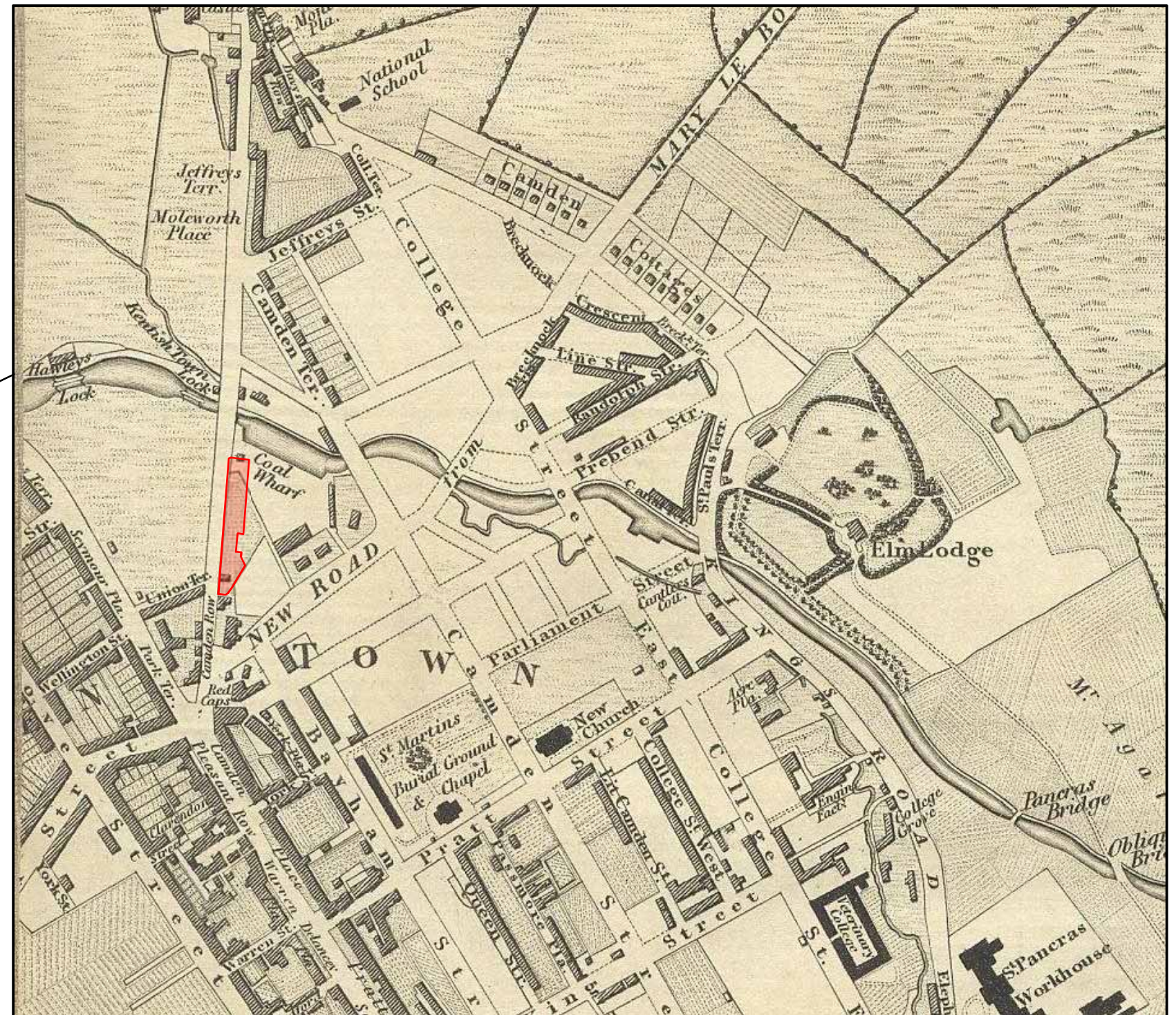
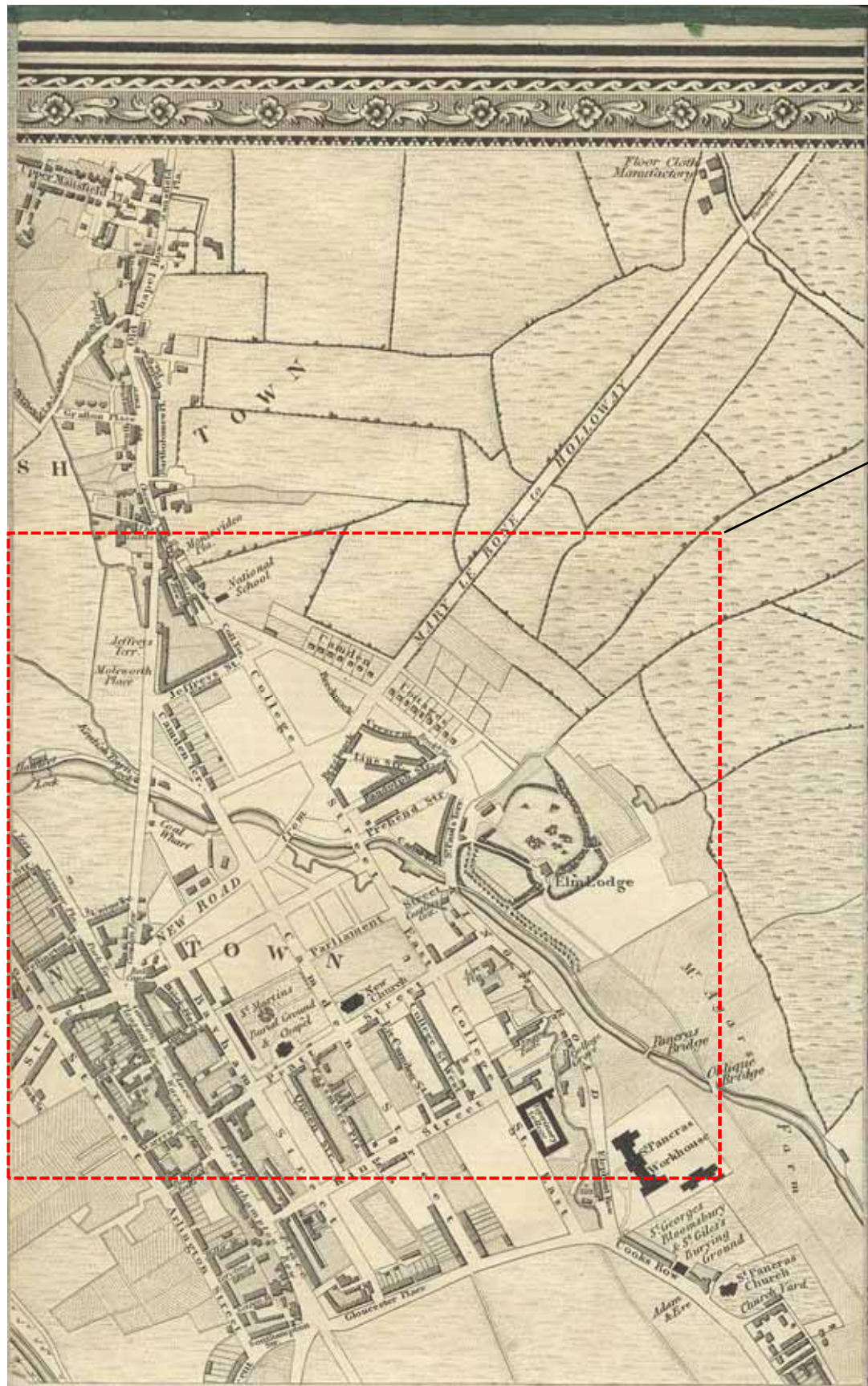


Figure 5. 1827: Greenwood Map of London, approximate locations of site marked in red.

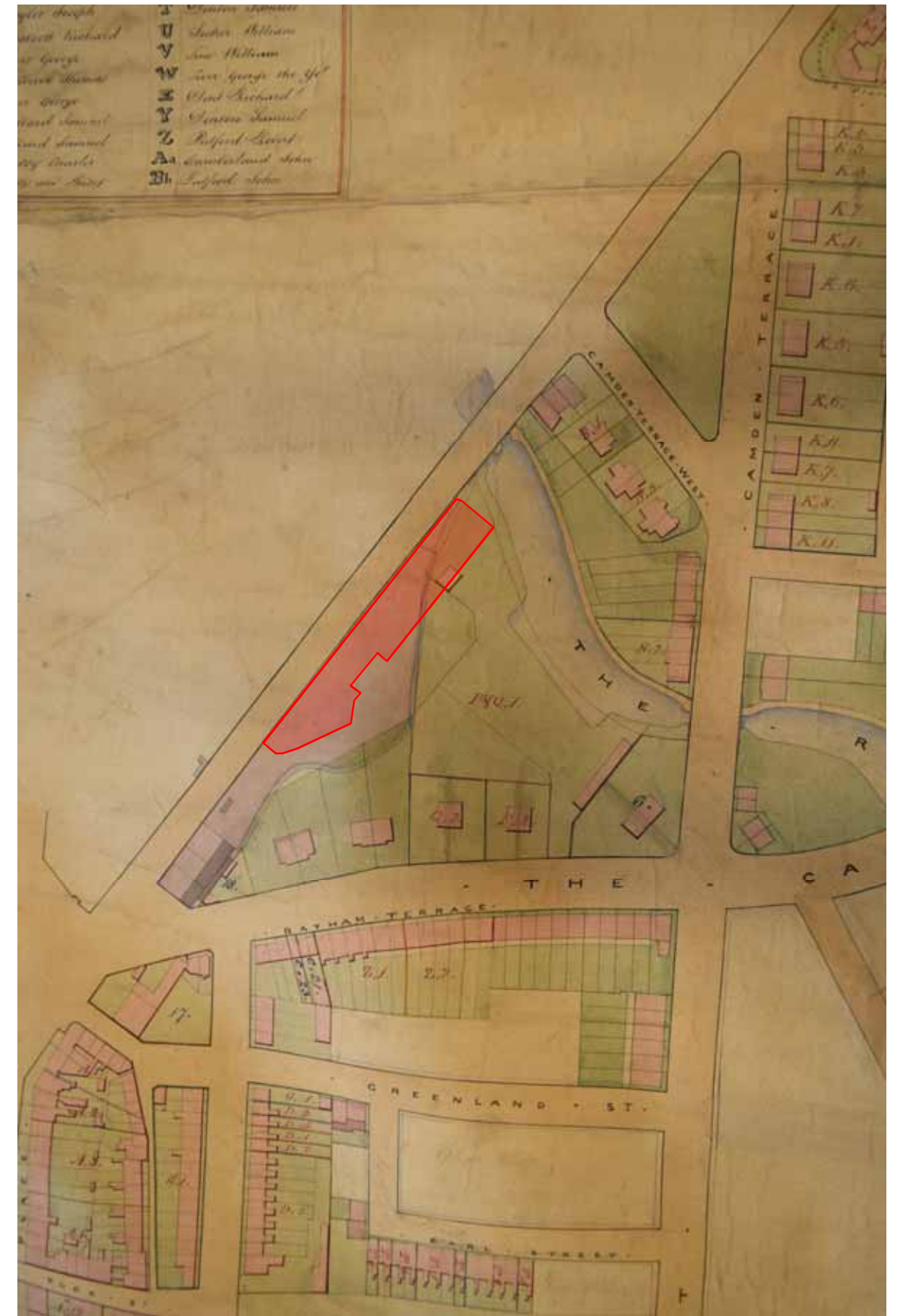


Figure 6. 1833: Camden Town Estate Map, approximate locations of site marked in red.
