


Figure 17. 1962: OS Map. Source: NLS, http://maps.nls.uk/view/102902560 (accessed March 2017)




Figure 20. Date Unknown: The other Red Cap, A naïve representation of the road junction, Brown's Dairy is to the left and the Halfway House pub is in the centre. Camden High Street leads north pat the dairy with Kentish Town Road visible between the Dairy and Halfway House and Camden Road is the right-most of the roads visible in the image.




Figure 25. 1960s: Looking north-west from a tall building near Camden Bridge, with tile-clad warehouses and offices on the banks to either side of the Regents Canal, and Kentish Town Bridge in the midground. The buildings in the foreground may have been owned by the Aerated Bread Company, who had premises in this area.


