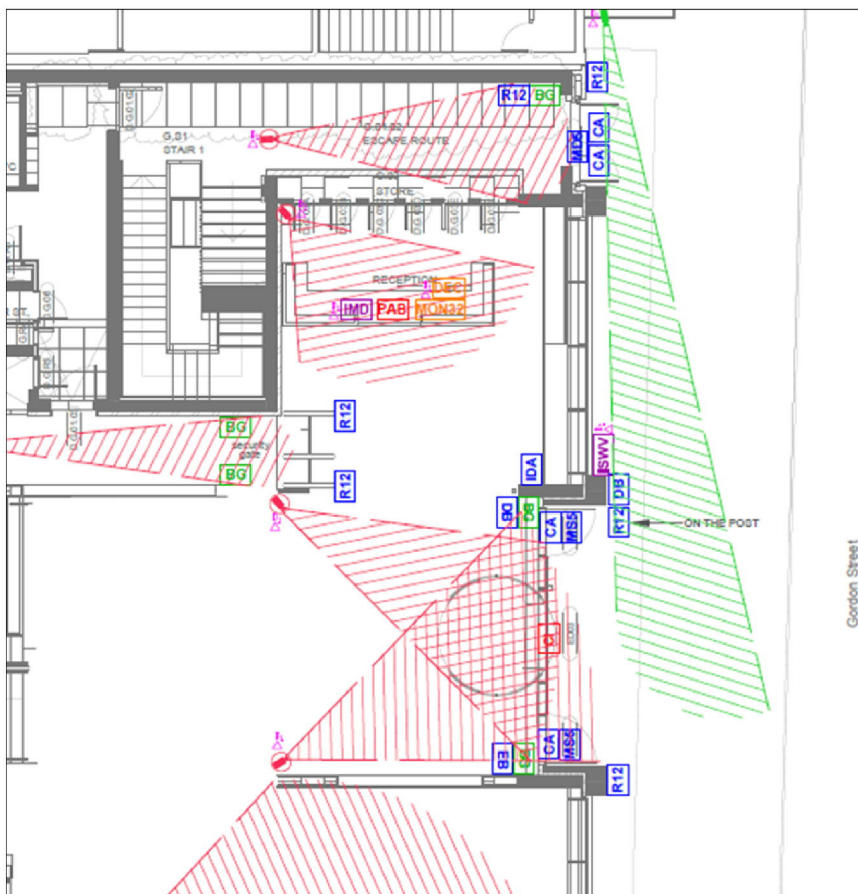

Below is a snapshot from the building's security strategy.

You can see access controlled card readers ("R12") doors either side of the main circular drum door into the building from Gordon Street. Outside normal working hours (08:00 – 18:00), the circular drum door is locked and you can only access the building via the access controlled side doors.

If someone does not have a UCL access card, they are required to use an intercom system which connects them to speaking to the guard on the front desk. A security guard will be present on the front desk 24 hours a day, even during staff breaks.
