The owner has withheld payment claiming we have not fulfilled specifications and claims that we have to take a further 3m off the height and reduce the southern stem back to the boundary line.

It is the our professional opinion that we carried out the work as per the original spec. and any further pruning at this time is would be detrimental to the tree's health. The tension on the cable bracing that was installed by a previous tree surgeon has slackened sufficiently due to our work and generally speaking we feel we have done an exemplary job with a mature specimen tree that would be damaged by further work.
