Thank you for allowing me comment on planning application 2018/0862/P which relates to the installation of a telephone kiosk outside 12 College Parade, Finchley Road, NW3.

I have previously commented on this proposal when it was originally to be positioned outside 20 Northway Parade, NW3. Those previous comments which relate to crime and anti-social behaviour are still as relevant today as they did last year. I have no issues with the change in location as previously the telephone kiosk was going to be placed in what is best described as a pedestrian 'choke point' due to the presence of various street furniture and the presence of stairs due to the levels of the land. The proposed location is a lot more open so it will be worth considering if adding a telephone kiosk there will actually make that a place where pedestrian activity becomes constrictive.

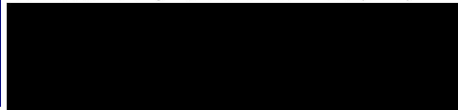
