The gardens including the ornamental trees and lawns are part of a mature well balanced Victorian garden. I understand that the gardens and fence posts nearest the houses are also Grade II* listed. At the time of listing (approx. 1950) the fence posts, hedges and fences constituted a mature front entrance to the Village balanced with No 2 Holly Village. This included the holly tree which is the subject of this Application. Camden recently gave permission for the removal of the privet hedge outside No 1 Since then No 1 have removed several of the listed fence posts and the lattice fence that is a constituent part of Holly Village. There are 142 lattice fence panels around Holly Village - the only ones missing are the 11 sections outside No 1. This has been an a determined effort by No 1 to remove all the Victorian features around their house. So - the hedge has gone (thanks to Camden) - the lattice fence has been removed, the listed posts have been removed - and now they want to remove the mature holly tree that balances with the mature holly tree in No 2 Holly Village. This tree is mature - probably 150 years old. It is an ornamental holly tree - not a vigorous woodland tree - and is no danger to the house. It is pruned on a regular basis by the Village management committee. Please do not allow the destruction of this tree as it will provide further reasons for No 1 to remove everything original from their garden Please review the procedure for No 1 to re-instate the listed fence posts.
