Dear David

I write as the lead member for Tackling Health Inequality and Promoting Independence in Camden, As such we will ensure that improving health and wellbeing and reducing inequalities is a focus in all the councils work. We are also working with residents to see that they get all the support they need close to home.

I would like to object to this planning application. To deprive approximately 1,800 patients of a service at a 'good practice' contravenes the planning policy which ensures existing community facilities are retained for the wider benefit of the community. As far as I am aware there isn't any spare capacity for these patients at other practices in the area. Those more vulnerable residents and those with mobility issues are familiar with the present doctors and would need a period of sustained support to transfer to another facility.

There is a process whereby the CCG would facilitate a period of patient and public engagement, which hasn't happened in this instance, and there seems to be some confusion around the lead doctors intentions.

I would ask the planning committee to refuse planning permission for change of use and retain this building as a doctors surgery.
