e.g. Oak (T3) - fell because of excessive shading and low amenity value. Replant with one standard ash in the same place.

Bay tree (T1) Take down two of the tree main stems to create a single stem bay tree. Reduce size of the tree to improve light to under laying hedge and improve light to the flats. Also reduce root growth to help future damage to path.

The Bay tree has three main stems, I would propose to take down the two on the right as you look at the house closes to the path.
