Re: Trees at 58a Reddington Road

Further to my visit on 18th January 2019, I am pleased to attach a sketch plan and a tree schedule describing the trees and making recommendations.

Although the robinia (T1) is an attractive tree, the base is heavily decayed making it a safety concern. Although the crown could be reduced, this would only be a short term, temporary measure, so felling is therefore recommended.

The veteran oak (T2) is an exceptional tree with high amenity and conservation value. Removal of the competing cypress (T3) is therefore recommended, along with coppicing of the holly (T5) to allow more light through to the canopy. A suppressed yew (T4) and a dead tree (T6) are also recommended for removal.


All tree works should be carried out by a reputable contractor, preferably one approved by the Arboricultural Association (www.trees.org.uk), to the standards set out in BS 3998:2010 British Standard recommendations for Tree Work.

Since the site falls within a Conservation Area you need to make an application to the council before any tree work is undertaken.
